Wrangler-Counselor Requirements:

(Wrangler - Counselor requirements include all the above statements under "All CLBC Staff Will Be")

- Want campers to know Christ and grow in that relationship.
- Are willing to share faith with campers.
- Have a servant like attitude working with campers.
- Want to have tons of fun working, living, investing in kids.
- Hold to the statement that "Camp is for kids".
- On time to staff meetings, assigned areas, and activities.

Responsibilities:

- Care for physical, emotional, social, and spiritual needs of campers in your cabin.
- Lead Bible studies and talk to cabin campers individually about their spiritual journey.
- Assist in horsemanship riding lessons.
- Teach horsemanship ground lessons.
- Help maintain a safe, fun, and educational environment during ranch activities.
- Enforce all camp safety rules and other regulations.
- Work cooperatively with the Ranch Director and other staff in group activities.
- Daily invest in each ranch campers in your cabin.
