- Experienced with teaching riding and ground lessons
- Effective communication skills
- Able to lead both staff and campers
- Can handle a high-energy environment of horses and campers
- Must be able to manage both horses and kids in a safe, educational, and fun way
- Self-disciplined and motivated
- Able to lead, organize, and delegate
- A leader that people look up to.

Wrangler Requirements:

- Want staff to reach their full potential and to know Christ and grow in that relationship.
- Are willing to share faith and experiences with other staff and campers.
- Have a servant like attitude working with staff.
- Want to have tons of fun working, living, investing in staff and campers.

- Can plan and run cabin activities and large group games.

Responsibilities:

- Care for physical, emotional, social, and spiritual needs of staff and campers.

- Instruct riding lessons of up to 10 campers at one time.
- Lead horsemanship ground lessons.
- Lead and plan ranch activities and programming.
- Oversee ranch area when Ranch Manager is not present.
- Help maintain a safe, fun, and educational environment during ranch activities.
- Enforce all camp safety rules and other regulations.
- Work cooperatively with the Ranch Manager and other staff in group activities.
- Help maintain horse care and development.
- Any other instructions from Ranch Manager.
